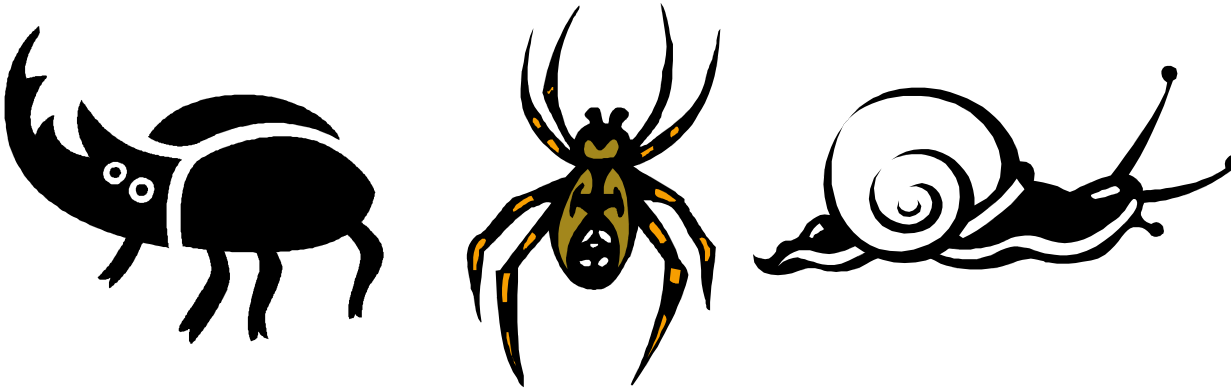


Make a bug passport activity

- Fill out the ‘My Details’ section (or ask a parent/guardian to)
- Ask a parent/guardian to sign the ‘Parent Consent’ section
- Send it to: **Buglife, Bug Passport activity, First Floor, 60 Bridge Street, Peterborough, PE1 1DY** to arrive by **1st September**.

Make a Bug Passport activity rules

1. We do ask you for your full name, age and address but we will only use this to contact you should we publish your picture or to send you a small prize, or to display your name, town and age on the Buglife website or in publications if we decide to show your picture.
2. Only Buglife has access to your personal details and we will not pass them on to anyone else. You must provide Buglife with the required details if you wish to enter this competition.
3. Only one entry will be accepted per person.
4. Entrants must obtain permission from their parent or guardian before entering the competition.
5. Entries must be submitted by post using the Bug Passport entry competition form. They must be sent to the correct postal address and forms must be fully completed.
6. This activity is only open to UK residents under the age of 13 at the closing date. Buglife reserves the right to request proof of age
7. All entries must be received by 5pm on Friday 1st September 2009. Buglife does not accept any responsibility for late or lost entries. Proof of sending is not proof of receipt.
8. Your Bug Passport design must be entirely your own work. By sending your design to Buglife you agree to grant us the right to display your artwork online or in our publications, and to give your first name and home town. We may display your picture at any point from the date that we receive it.
9. Please note that unfortunately entries cannot be returned.
10. Buglife's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
