

🕷️ SCRAMMY SPIDER CAKES 🕷️



You will need:

- Small chocolate muffins/cupcakes (bought or home-made)
- Chocolate biscuit fingers
- White chocolate buttons
- Icing pens - black and red
- A little icing sugar

1. Take the cake out of its case and cut the top off to make it level
2. Turn upside down and place in the middle of a plate
3. Halve 4 chocolate biscuit fingers and arrange the 8 halves around the cake, 4 on each side - these are the legs (the legs could be 'glued' to the cake with a blob of icing paste if you wish - see below)



4. Mix a little icing sugar with a few drops of water to make a thick sticky paste
5. Use the icing paste to 'glue' 2 white chocolate buttons to the front of the cake - these are the eyes



6. Use a black icing pen to put a blob on each chocolate button, and a red one to make a smile underneath the buttons

7. Your scrumptious spider cake is finished! Leave the icing to dry (if you can!) before eating
